Thesis: The joy in life is discovered in the journey – not the destination!

Last week of the year, John reviews his year, makes notes. Does some personal selfexamination. Asks himself 7 questions. You should never leave something; you should go to something. He asks God for a word for the next year.

John Wooden – taught us how to live life. The journey doesn't determine your joy; you do that. Know there is joy in the journey.

- 1. Live intentionally don't accept your life, lead your life. Become intentional in your life. Begin with the end in mind
- 2. Find your purpose you can't connect the dots looking forward, but looking backward you can connect them. They don't clearly see all the steps but they clearly see the first one. Find your purpose you find your passion, your sweet spot.
- 3. You define your success this is John's success
 - 1. Personal Success The closest to me love me and respect me the most
 - 2. Growth Success knowing, growing, sowing
 - 3. Leadership Success Adding value to leaders who multiply value to others
- 4. Grow every day will bring you greater joy than anything else. Personal growth is happiness it's fulfilling, you are seeing and feeling and realizing you're evolving into a better person
- 5. Add value to others get over yourself. Value people, add value to people, encourage others to add value to people.
- 6. Stay with your strengths People don't pay for average
- 7. Think Successfully how you think determines your world
- 8. Partner with others understand that when you join others team, the value of expediting improvement is to work with good partners. None of us is smarter than all of us.

9. Embrace difficulty - Next book is on failure. We do hard so we learn how to do harder. The greatness of leadership is to do difficult--to do more difficult as you get good. Respect is earned on difficult ground. Young leaders--discovered just

Each step compounds the results of the previous steps. You don't step your way to success...each step, well done, is success!
